688/19 The clerk and the chairman explained the difficulties they had encountered trying to push forward with a scheme to install toilet facilities at St. Peter's Church.

688/19 The council received an update from the planning dept about the contravention of the planning permission granted to the owners of North Farm and Gildingwells. The dept would be serving legal papers on the owner claiming breach of contract over use of the building during the last 10 years.
